President's Report

The Hide-A-Way Hills 2019 annual budget was approved at the January meeting of the HAH Board of Trustees (BOT). The budget is developed each year by the HAH Management Committee and they, in turn, recommend it to the Board. The 2019 budget is balanced and permits us to operate legally through the current year. However, the budget is very austere and does not provide for key projects needed to maintain this community's infrastructure and safety.

The Management Committee is working to define clearly our most pressing infrastructure needs and critical deferred maintenance projects that should no longer be deferred. One example of deferred maintenance is very noticeable as you journey through the Hills, and that is the condition of our ditches and culverts. Many of these are deteriorated, and as a result, threaten portions of our road system. Deferring this project much longer will inevitably result in the need to spend an even greater sum of money than if we take actions to prevent this problem now.

Additionally, no funding is available in the 2019 budget for projects that members have told us are important. These include security gate system enhancements to manage our entrances more effectively and that improve safety, and post office improvements to make these buildings more functional and to address water issues that create icy and slippery conditions. Some members would also like to

improve our front entrance and guard shack so that they too are more functional but also better reflect the nature of our community.

You will remember that a proposed assessment increase was narrowly defeated last summer. This increase would have been put toward the projects described briefly above as well as others. I am hopeful that if the Board makes a clear and compelling case for these needed improvements that the members will support additional funding.

A special committee is being formed to work with the Management Committee, the Long-Range Planning Committee and the BOT members to review these needed improvements. Once this review is completed, the BOT will consider making another proposal for an assessment increase.

On another important note, I would like to recognize the impressive effort made by our Maintenance and Security staff over the weekend of January 12th and 13th to address the conditions created by the snow storm that dumped nearly nine inches of snow on our roads. These staff members came in early, stayed late, and at least one, stayed all night to ensure our community remained accessible and safe that weekend. This is a level of service that many other lake communities do not have, and I think deserves our acknowledgement and applause.


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2019 Amenity Fund Distribution





At the December 18 Board of Trustee meeting, the trustees changed the load limit from 5 ton to 13 ton beginning February 1 continuing through April 15, 2019

General Rule #25

"Load limits will be placed on all roads during inclement weather to prevent damage to the roads. No vehicles in excess of thirteen (13) ton gross weight, will be permitted during such enforcement, except emergency vehicles or any vehicle approved by the General Manager. Penalty for violation of the load limits will be a \$500.00 fine to the member, per occurrence."

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2019 WATERCRAFT REGISTRATION AND DOCK REQUEST INSTRUCTIONS

Pontoon Launch is scheduled for April 27, 2019

If it floats, it must be registered each year with the HAH Office. PLEASE NOTE that tri-toon pontoons cannot be trailered by the Lakes Committee.

INCOMPLETE FORMS AND REQUESTS WILL NOT BE PROCESSED. **PREVIOUS YEAR FORMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.** Please be sure the form is filled in completely, accurately and legibly.

If you were assigned a Club-issued dock last year, and wish to be eligible to retain that same dock assignment, the 2019 Watercraft Registration and Dock Request form must be received in the HAH Club Office by 12 Noon on April 12, 2019, properly completed and with required proofs provided. There will be no exceptions made. **Previous year forms will not be accepted – a new form must be completed and signed each year.**

If you are registering watercraft only and NOT requesting a dock, the Registration form and all necessary proofs may be submitted to the HAH Office any time. The current year's decal must be placed on the watercraft BEFORE it is placed on any lake in HAH.

PROOF OF OWNERSHIP – The member must provide a copy of the watercraft title, current state registration or a notarized bill of sale showing the watercraft is owned by the member of record. Please keep in mind that state registrations expire so please make sure you submit the current one issued. Watercraft must be owned by a member of record.

PROOF OF INSURANCE – <u>Every year</u> the member must provide a current copy of their watercraft insurance document showing the description of the watercraft they are registering, the current effective dates of the policy and the limits of liability for watercraft coverage for all motorized watercraft.

WATERCRAFT DECALS AND DOCK ASSIGNMENTS – Will be mailed as soon as possible after the April 12, 2019 deadline. Requests received after the deadline will be mailed as they are received and processed. Please put your 2019 decal on your pontoon prior to launch day.

THE HAH BOATING RULES STATE:

17. Docks that have been assigned and remain empty for a period of three (3) weeks will be reassigned, unless the Hide-A-Way Hills Club office has had prior notification. Acceptable reasons include vacation, repairs, or other reasons approved by the Club.

If you are assigned a Club-issued boat dock and the dock will be empty for a period of three (3) weeks or longer, you must notify the HAH Office in writing, via U.S. Mail, e-mail to hahoffice@hahclub.net, or fax to 740-569-4036.

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



PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Jim Krygier

Many of the improvements requested by Members will not be addressed without additional funds. We have many infrastructure needs that will go without improvement and we will have to decide which maintenance projects to defer.

We will soon put together an adhoc committee to work with the Management Committee, Long Range Planning and BOT members to look at these projects and how to fund improvements. As you know, last summer an assessment increase was narrowly defeated. It is my belief that if we make a compelling case to the membership about the necessary improvements, that we will find there is sufficient support to provide additional funds.
