President's Report

The summer is nearly finished and what a season it has been! The HAH community has been able to enjoy so many concerts, golf events and other committee activities along with the great weather for boating, swimming and just being outdoors. This has been one of the busiest summers that I can remember! On behalf of the Board, a big thank you goes out to our many volunteers who make HAH a very special place.

On a more sobering note, the disappointingly narrow defeat of the assessment increase has led the Board to initiate a project to help us better understand your reasons for either supporting the assessment or voting no for it. Board member Annie Kerregan is coordinating this on-line effort. An announcement will be made soon with more information. It is very important that you share your thoughts as the community's financial condition will soon require us to make some serious decisions. Without additional funding, services will need to be reduced to ensure that we maintain a balanced budget. All options will be considered ranging from the way we manage community security, maintain our roads, and maintain our amenities. Please take the opportunity when it comes to share your thoughts.

One example of difficult decisions is evident as you drive along Hide-A-Way Hills Lane past Lakes Arrowhead and Tomahawk. You should have received an email

explaining that these lakes must be lowered to repair the spillway pipes that have corroded over the past fifty years. This project will consume nearly all of the capital funding that was earmarked for other 2019 projects to benefit the community. Fortunately, the costs are being offset somewhat by a contribution of \$20,000 from the Lakes Committee through its Amenity funds. Regardless, we absolutely must do the project and will postpone or reduce other projects to do so.

Please note that we now have a vacancy on the Management Committee. If you are interested, please complete an application form and send it in or drop it off to the Club Office. It can also be found in the ECHO. The Management Committee is an integral part of the community and is charged with making decisions on all day-to-day operating decisions.

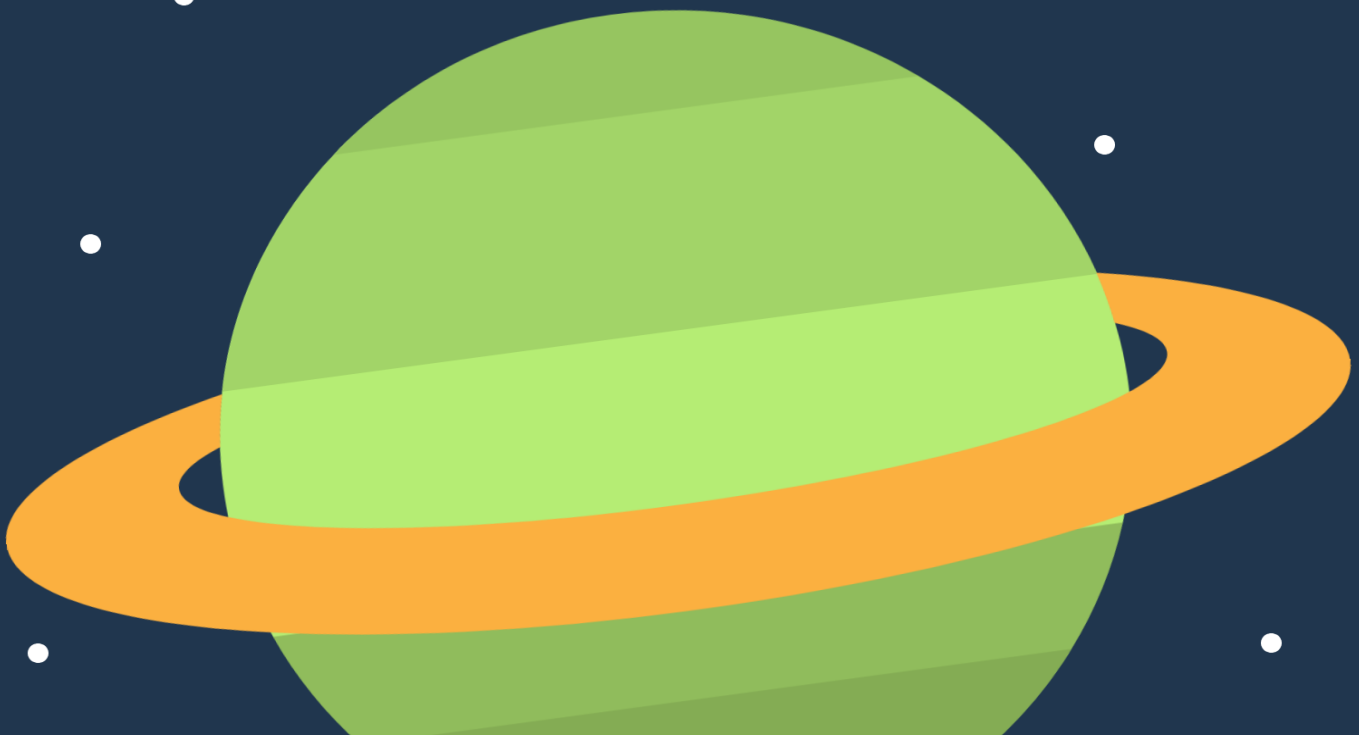

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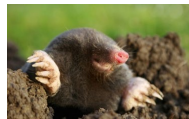

The Committee will also be putting their funds toward stocking a variety of fish in all of our lakes this Fall.



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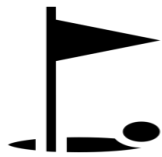

HORSING AROUND

A LITTLE HISTORY ABOUT THE STABLES:

Did you know the original intention of HAH was to be an equestrian community? Neither did I, but apparently there was language in the development documents of HAH regarding this. The Barn is quite old, and was one of the original structures when the land developers purchased the land which is now known as HAH. Electric line easements were intended to be a network of horse trails. The stables are a wonderful amenity for HAH residents. Just as residents may have a boat dock for free, horse lovers may have a horse stall at the barn for free. With that being said, horses are not an inexpensive hobby. The owners must maintain their horses, provide food, maintain pastures, pay the vet bills, provide medicine, and put sweat equity into care of the barn, shelters, horses, pastures, fencing and stables. Clearly, this is a labor of love, and people love horses, because there is a waiting list for a stall. Currently, there are 9 horses keeping our stables lively.

TO FEED THE HORSES OR NOT FEED THE HORSES:

The Barn Committee welcomes visitors to the Barn area to visit with the horses. It is preferred that visitors go to the outside fence lines, and not in the stalls. That is for members' safety, as well as for the safety of the horses. The horses love treats of carrots and apples. Just cut them into quarters, and place them in your open flat hand. Oftentimes, Barn members notice other foods like celery, broccoli, and citrus in the pastures. It won't hurt the horses, but they likely will not eat those foods.

ARE THE FENCES ELECTRIC:

The fence lines are **all electric**. When visiting the horses, they will come to the edges of the pasture or to the gate to interact if they would like company. For the safety of the visitors, do not visit the horses inside the pastures. Horses startle easily, and this is simply for the safety for all. There are times that the electric fence malfunctions, and the horses may get out of the pasture. They have strong herd instincts, and will not go far. Call Security, and one of the Barn members will take care of the matter.

THE BARN CATS:

The barn has 3 cats living at the barn which have been spayed/neutered. They love visitors. The Barn Committee feeds these cats and asks that **no one else feed the cats** because this extra food sits around and brings opossum to the barn. The opossum hide in the hay and carry a disease that is quite devastating to the horses. This is one of the reasons members should remain on the outside of the Barn. Having children play in the hay where opossum feces reside is not a good mix. Hay bales can also be unstable, and fall, which is another safety concern. The Barn Committee does accept cat food donations. You may drop this donation in the black plastic garbage can near the entrance of the upper part of the barn or leave it with Security.

HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED AND SUPPORT THE STABLES?

Angie Ryan and Mary Kay Banville co-chair the Barn Committee. There are 11 members on this committee. Typically, the committee members have a horse residing at the stable, but other HAH members who are interested in volunteering at the barn are welcome to join this committee. They meet regularly after caring for the horses and pastures. In addition to caring for the horses and pastures, the Barn Committee raises money to supplement the Amenity Funds allocated to the Barn. *HAH Amenity Fund expenditures include roof repairs, a new pasture shelter, sand for the arena, new barn doors and fence line mowing. The committee has raised funds that have helped to complete ongoing fence repairs, broken lines, painting the arena, seeding the pastures, new wheelbarrows, etc.*

Their two major fundraisers are **Boo at the Barn** and the **Pony Palooza**. Boo at the Barn is a fun Halloween event for all age groups which will occur at the barn on October 26th from 5-7 pm. There will be food offered for a donation, along with a decorated barn and candy for Halloween. Children come in costume and many young hearted, fun adults show up in costume as well. Feel free to come out with or without a costume to enjoy the festivities, Halloween music and friendship.

The Barn Committee needs volunteers to help decorate the barn and donate candy for the event. It's a great way to meet people and get out of your home to socialize. Please contact Gracie and Mike Adams at 740-974-0352 if you are willing to help with Boo at the Barn on the 26th or volunteer your time in advance to prepare for the event.

The other fundraiser is Pony Palooza. Don't be fooled by the name, this is not just for little ones. The horses that live at the barn provide guided rides around the arena for a small donation. There may be other animals to enjoy for this event as well, including snakes, donkeys, emus and ferrets. Other activities such as a child craft item will be available as well. Adults and children are welcome. A meal is offered at both fundraisers for a donation. ***Come on out and "horse around"*** to support the Barn Committee.

Family guest passes are mailed to the member. If the family guest has more than one vehicle, they will need to stop at Security with each vehicle, show their card, register that vehicle and be issued a decal for that vehicle. 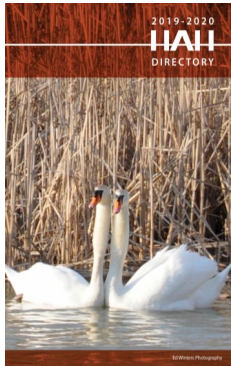

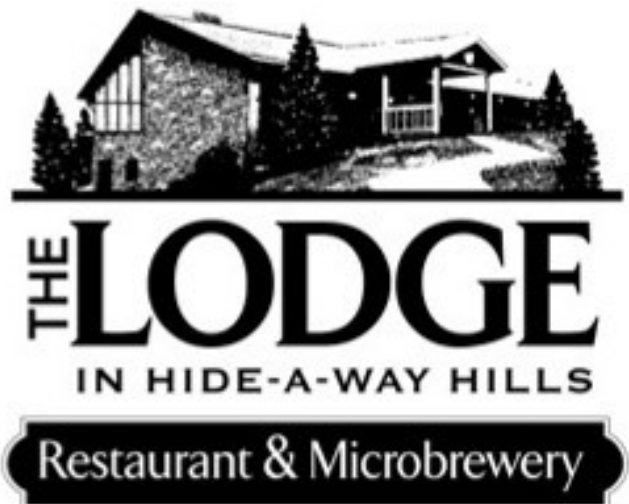
