



Support the Raise the Deck campaign



The Hide-A-Way Hills Club Board of Trustees is asking for approval of the following proposed changes to the Code of Regulations:

BALLOT ISSUE #2

Article II, Section 4, A. Dues and Assessments

The dues of members shall be the assessments imposed pursuant to this Code of Regulations, as amended from time to time, and paragraph 8 of the Deed Restrictions for Hide-A-Way Hills as to said lots and parcels.

A. Effective January 1, 2017, the <u>Normal Lot Assessment</u> for a lot or parcel (whether developed or undeveloped) owned by a member or members, is \$160.97 per month.

Effective January 1 of each calendar year from 2018 through 2027, said Normal Lot Assessment shall increase each year by the percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban consumers (CPI-W*), as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor, for the preceding month of September of each calendar year as compared to the identical index issued for the month of September of the previous calendar year, with a limit to the increase of 5% of the normal lot assessment charged for the prior calendar year. In the event of a decrease in the index, there shall be no decrease in the Normal Lot Assessment.

These assessments shall be payable in advance, either annually, semi-annually, quarterly or monthly.

*CPI-W is the Bureau of Labor index that is tied to Social Security.

BALLOT ISSUE #3

Article VII, Section 3, paragraph 2 Nominating Committee

<u>Composition and Timing</u>. At the January regular meeting of the Board, the President shall appoint from the members (two of whom shall not be the members of the Board) a committee of five persons, with the President as Chairman, to nominate members for the Board of Trustees for the ensuing election.

BALLOT ISSUE #4

Article IX, Section 2, b. Special Individual Assessments.

b. Prior to any Special Individual Assessment being enforced by the Club against any member, that member shall have the right to a hearing before the Board or duly appointed committee and a right to cross-examine any witness against that member at the hearing. Such rights must be exercised, in writing, within 10 calendar days of the Special Individual Assessment notification, or the right is forfeited. Hide-A-Ways Hills ORV Rules for Operators under age 16

(Approved February 21, 2017 at the Board of Trustee Meeting)

- 14. Notwithstanding the above numbered Vehicle Rules, and the Off Road Vehicle Rules that apply to the designated ORV track and trails, the following shall apply to all Off-Road-Vehicle (ORV) operators under the age of 16 when using Hide-A-Way Hills roadways. "ORV" shall include, but not necessarily be limited to any ATV, Utility Vehicle, Side-By-Side, Go-Kart, Dirt Bike or Golf Cart. It shall not include cars, vans, trucks and SUVs.
- A. All ORV operators under the age of 16 and their parent(s) must attend a HAH ORV Rules Meeting sponsored by the ORV Committee.
- B. No ORV may be operated by a person under the age of 12 without a parent or responsible adult present.
- C. Such ORV operators must understand and comply with the vehicle manufacturer's recommendations for safe operation and ensure that the maximum number of passengers does not exceed the number of seats in the vehicle.
- D. In addition, helmets must be worn by all such operators and riders of an ATV, Go-Kart or Dirt Bike. Seat Belts must be worn by all such operators and riders in vehicles where they are supplied. Go-Karts and other low-profile ORVs less than 4 feet from the ground must display a flag extending vertically at least 4 feet.
- E. The parents of all under-age ORV operators must read and sign the "Parental Consent and Release" form acknowledging the inherent risk associated with operating an ORV, and attesting that they and their child understand and will comply with all HAH rules.
- F. Upon confirmed attendance at an aforementioned ORV Committee sponsored meeting, and completion of the "Parental Consent and Release" form, a sticker will be issued for display on any ORV to be used by an under-age operator. No ORV shall be operated by an under-age driver on HAH roadways without such a sticker clearly displayed. Violations of these rules are subject to the Schedule of Fines section of the Hide-A-Way Hills Club Rules.

<u>HAH Rules – Rule to Prohibit Access to Club Facilities for Commercial Use</u> <u>Passed at Board of Trustee Meeting on 3/21/2017</u>

GUEST PRIVILEGES

3. Utilizing any club facility, amenity or common area for commercial use is prohibited unless approved by the Board or General Manager. Any Member, Permanent or Family Guest, or Long-Term Tenant who registers a guest(s) for the purpose of providing them paid services while using club facilities, amenities or common areas will be subject to a fine of up to \$5,000 per incident.

HAH Rule Changes to the Fine Schedule

Approved by the Board of Trustees on 4/18/2017

Class 2 Definition: An offense that has caused or could have caused minor injury to the accused or to another person or has caused minor loss of or damage up to \$500 to any personal property or Club property.

Class 4 Definition: More serious offenses or violations, that could have or has caused serious injury or damage and/or willful destruction of personal or Club property, will be referred to the Board of Trustees for Article IX action and will result in a minimum fine of \$250.00 plus restitution of losses.

This Fine Schedule is not intended to supersede any previous fine references contained in the Hide-A-Way Hills Club Rules.

HARCUM PARK ORV RULES

Approved by the Board of Trustees on April 18, 2017

SHEETS ROAD PROPERTY

The common natural area known as the Sheets Road Property is available for hiking, horseback riding and quiet recreational use. The following rules apply when utilizing this area:

- 1. Motorized vehicles are permitted only on Maya Lane and the designated parking area, except authorized security, emergency and maintenance vehicles. Vehicle parking is available off Maya Lane except as stated in item 5.
- 2. Trespassing onto adjacent private property is prohibited.
- 3. No fires of any kind are permitted.
- Access is permitted only during daylight hours.
- 5. Side-by-side utility vehicles will be allowed ingress and egress only to Harcum Park from May 1 through October 31. They must stay on trail to Harcum Park.

Quads or ATVs and dirt bikes are prohibited.

Use four-wheel-drive.

Speed limit is 5 mph. Use caution, pedestrians or horses may be on the trail.

Three keys to a gate by the Maya Lane parking area will be available at security on a first-come first-serve basis.

Keys must be signed out and signed in when returned.

Users must close and lock the gate upon entrance and exit.

- Harcum Park hours restricted to 11 AM to 8 PM or sunset whichever comes first. Keys cannot be picked up before 10:30 AM or after 6 PM.
- 7. The trail to Harcum Park may be closed at the discretion of security if heavy rain or conditions makes the trail unsafe.
- 8. The entire area is a quiet zone. Once you get to the top park your vehicle. Enjoy the beauty and serenity of Harcum Park but please respect the privacy of the members who own the house in The Reserve.
- 9. All Hide-A-Way Hills rules pertaining to common ground apply to the reserve of Hide-A-Way Hills also.
- 10, Infractions of the Harcum Park guidelines or Hide–A–Way Hills rules could result in fines being assessed or depending on the seriousness of the infraction an Article IX with a minimum fine of \$250.
- 11. There are no restroom facilities at Harcum Park.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Greg Ptacin

• We will be submitting five names as candidates for the Board of Trustees for 2017. We talked to well over 30 people; the Committee really worked hard to get nominees for the four openings we have. The way that it is going to work is the fourth vote getter will receive the one year term to fill the place of a former Board member who did not complete their term. HAH relies on volunteers and this community lives or dies with volunteers on our Board, Management Committee and our committees. Members can still be nominated; they need fifteen signatures and we will get those signatures if needed. We need people to step forward.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Ginger Reed

Total Committee funds in the Vinton County National Bank on March 31, 2017 were \$59,963.56. Motion to approve made by Ginger Reed; second by Patrick Foy – **Motion Carried**

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT – Jim Sigafoose

- The Lake of the Four Seasons: The water is at full pool at 815.6 this has not changed since the dam repair. There has been some talk about the water being higher but it is not as the spillway level has not changed. The target is still April 29th to open the lake up to full motor usage but we can open earlier if we get the docks done. We have ordered the new LED lights to be installed top of the dam and there will be one at each dock to be installed in May. We have also ordered new buoys and the Lakes Committee has split the cost of those and buoys should be in by the middle of May. New trash cans have been ordered for the end of each dock; we are debating on whether or not to make all or some of them recycling containers versus trash containers. The lake monitoring plan has been submitted to ODNR.
- We will be moto paving from Kusa, where we left off last year down to Security at the front gate. It is a shorter distance than what we did last year, so we will purchase five loads of chip and seal mix versus two loads that we purchased last year.
- New deck proposal for the Lodge: The Food, Fun & Fellowship Committee is working on fundraising for that project.
- We have added one full-time maintenance employee which brings us up to seven total and four seasonal employees.
- Management has been discussing the continuing need to mow the airstrip; we mow that weekly and it takes about four to five
 hours to mow. Since it is an HAH amenity and an FAA airstrip, we are going to continue to mow it but we are discussing usage
 and cost effectiveness to continue mowing.
- We are currently working on the septic system at the front entrance bathrooms and we have been in contact with Hocking County to approve a new septic system. We had the system pumped once this spring and it immediately filled back up due to the heavy rains. So, we have port-a-johns down there now as the bathroom are closed. And since the bathrooms are closed, we are using this time to reseal the floors.
- We are also having the Clubhouse fascia replaced as it's well-rotted. Due to the height of that we had to get a contractor with a scissor lift to do the project.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT – Randy Swetnam

- Delinquency totals for March 2017 were \$53,124 for regular assessments and as of this month \$50,795. Roads delinquencies
 went up by a small amount due to late fees. We have had no new Roads delinquencies because the assessment is not due
 until June 1st. We do have one bankruptcy account, but in all, the delinquencies are down this month.
- Dam assessment total right now is \$298,381 and we sold three more HAH lots for the full price of \$12,000.
- The new dock which is the extension of E dock will be delivered tomorrow along with the 10-foot extension. This will make it even with the rest of the docks. Hopefully the new dock extension will be together this week and we will have everything anchored this week depending on the weather/wind.

- As of right now there are 39 people on the dock waiting list; however, those new docks have not been assigned so16 slips will
 come off the 39 on the waiting list. Some individuals on the waiting list want a certain dock and some of them already have a
 dock but are waiting to move to another.
- Management approved the purchase of a used backhoe. Paul Heimberger was instrumental putting this deal together for us. We asked CAT to come out and give a price on some of the equipment we no longer use such as the grader, the old backhoe purchased in 2009 and the roller they gave us \$26,000 for those pieces of equipment.

There were some fireworks sparklers in the trash cans upstairs in the barn and we suspect someone was lighting these in the barn. We would like the cameras checked so we can find out who is responsible for this as it is a fire/safety hazard with all the hay in the barn.
- Tennis Committee would like to mention the fences leaning on the tennis courts Randy in process of having someone come out and take a look.
- Long Range Planning Committee has a new Chair, Dan Donovan. The meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month
 in the Great Room, the next meeting is May 9th.
- Food, Fun & Fellowship Committee is working on the fundraising for the Lodge deck.
- Adopt an Area Committee had their annual roads cleanup this past weekend and collected 12, 30-gallon bags of trash.

AUGUST CODE CHANGES

Article II

<u>Section 4</u>...Dues & Assessments. The dues of members shall be the assessments imposed pursuant to this Code of Regulations, as amended from time to time, and paragraph 8 of the Deed Restrictions for Hide-A-Way Hills as to said lots and parcels.

A. Effective January 1, 2008-2017, the <u>Normal Lot Assessment</u> for a lot or parcel (whether developed or undeveloped) owned by a member or members, was increased by \$9.22 per month to the amount of \$137.22 is \$160.97 per month.

Effective January 1 of each calendar year from 2009–2018 through 2018–2027, said Normal Lot Assessment shall increase each year by the percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban consumers (CPI-W*), as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor, for the preceding month of September of each calendar year as compared to the identical index issued for the month of September of the previous calendar year, with a limit to the increase of 5% of the normal lot assessment charged for the prior calendar year. In the event of a decrease in the index, there shall be no decrease in the Normal Lot Assessment.

These assessments shall be payable in advance, either annually, semi-annually, quarterly or monthly.

*CPI-W is the Bureau of Labor index that is tied to Social Security.

Article VII

Section 3...Nominating Committee.

Composition and Timing. At the March January regular meeting of the Board, the President shall appoint from the members (two of whom shall not be the members of the Board) a committee of five persons, with the President as Chairman, to nominate members for the Board of Trustees for the ensuing election.

Responsibilities. Such committee shall nominate persons from eligible Board members, various committees and the membership at large. All nominees must be in good standing. The nominations so made shall be posted in a notice on the bulletin board of the Lodge at least ninety (90) days before the election. Such notice to be signed by a duly authorized representative of the Nominating Committee. Additional nominations may be made by petition with a minimum of fifteen members' signatures, but no person shall be eligible for election whose name has not been posted at least eighty (80) days before the election, together with the names of the proposing members, and the Board of Trustees shall be immediately notified as to such nominations.

Article IX

Section 2... Special Individual Assessments.

a. Violations of the rules and regulations, Deed Restrictions or Code of Regulations of Hide-A-Way Hills Club may result in levying, as a Special Individual Assessment, the cost of enforcement against the owner of a lot for any violation of the terms of the rules and regulations, Deed Restrictions or Code of Regulations of Hide-A-Way Hills Club committed by such owner, family member thereof, or other licensee, invitee, tenant or guest thereof. Such Special Individual Assessments may include the schedule of fines established by the Board of Trustees. Such Special Individual Assessments levied against the owner, together with any attorney fees or other costs incurred by the Club, shall be a continuing lien against each lot that is charged with this assessment.

b. Prior to any Special Individual Assessment being enforced by the Club against any member, that member shall have the right to a hearing before the Board or duly appointed committee and a right to cross-examine any witness against that member at the hearing. Such rights must be exercised, in writing, within 10 calendar days of the Special Individual Assessment notification, or the right is forfeited. Hearings shall be held in closed session unless an open session is requested by the member(s).

HARCUM PARK ORV RULES Existing Rule as of March, 2017:

<u>SHEETS ROAD PROPERTY</u>
The common natural area known as the Sheets Road Property is available for hiking, horseback riding and quiet recreational use. The following rules apply when utilizing this area:

Motorized vehicles are permitted only on Maya Lane and the designated parking area, except authorized security, emergency and maintenance vehicles. Vehicle parking is available off Maya Lane except as stated in item 5.

Trespassing onto adjacent private property is prohibited.

No fires of any kind are permitted.

Access is permitted only during daylight hours.

Temporary Guidelines approved by Board for Summer/Fall of 2016:

Guidelines for a Test of a Rules Exception for Use of the Reserve

The following is being tested to allow more members to use Harcum Park. If no problems are encountered the current rule will be changed. It is important to note that if these guidelines are not followed all members HAH members could lose opportunity afforded below

Side-by-side utility vehicles will be allowed ingress and egress only to Harcum Park from May 1 through October 31. They must stay on trail to Harcum Park.

Quads or ATVs and dirt bikes are prohibited.

Use four-wheel-drive.

Speed limit is 5 mph. Use caution, pedestrians or horses may be on the trail.

Three keys to a gate by the Maya Lane parking area will be available at security on a first-come first-serve basis. Keys must be signed out and signed in when returned.

Users must close and lock the gate upon entrance and exit.

Harcum Park hours restricted to 11 AM to 8 PM or sunset whichever comes first. Keys cannot be picked up before 10:30 AM or after 6 PM.

The trail to Harcum Park may be closed at the discretion of security if heavy rain or conditions makes the trail unsafe. The trail to Harcum Park open to side by side utility vehicles through October 23, 2016.

The entire area is a quiet zone. Once you get to the top park your vehicle. Enjoy the beauty and serenity of Harcum Park but please respect the privacy of the members who own the house in The Reserve.

All Hide-A-Way Hills rules pertaining to common ground apply to the reserve of Hide-A-Way Hills also.

Allowing side by side utility vehicles access to Harcum Park is on a trial basis and can be rescinded at any time.

Infractions of the Harcum Park guidelines or Hide–A–Way Hills rules could result in fines being assessed or depending on the seriousness of the infraction an Article IX with a minimum fine of \$250.

There are no restroom facilities at Harcum Park.

FINE LANGUAGE CHANGES

Class 2 Definition: An offense that has caused or could have caused minor injury to the accused or to another person or has cause minor loss of or damage up to \$500.00 to any personal property or Club property.

Class 3 Definition: . . .

Class 4 Definition: More serious erimes offenses that could have or has caused serious injury or damage, such as dumping other than household garbage at dumpsters and/or willful destruction of personal or Club property, will be referred to the Board of Trustees for Article IX action and will result in a minimum fine of \$250.00 plus restitution of losses.

This Fine Schedule is not intended to supersede any previous fine references contained in the Hide-A-Way Hills Club Rules.
